

Reading List for Future Readers



Below are suggestions to get you inspired for every challenge - whether it involves reading or not. You are welcome to choose whatever books you like.

Creativity is encouraged! Families are welcome to interpret each challenge in the way that works best for them. You can always ask library staff for more suggestions.

Read an alphabet book & sing your ABCs

Letters make words, words make sentences, sentences make stories! Celebrate each letter with these alphabet reads.




An early reader




