

The Pantry is a partnership between the Healthy Communities of the Capital Area's now defunded SNAP-Ed program, and the Library.

The Pantry is conveniently located in our lobby, and open to anyone, no questions asked. The goal is to provide access to non-perishable foods for neighbors facing food insecurity. We will happily take ongoing donations of unexpired canned goods, pantry items and snacks. Consider this program as take what you need and give what you can.

Did you hear? The Friends of Lithgow Library are fundraising for a mobile book library.

The bookmobile will reach all corners of the city, providing materials for underserved residents




